A Proposed Wild & Scenic River and Wilderness Area

Westwater Canyon is a proposed Wild & Scenic River and combines all the components of a classic river trip: excellent whitewater, charming campsites, and great hikes. Part of the time you will drift leisurely at the rivers pace; then there is one day of extremely fun rapids. The Colorado River forces its way into narrow Black Granite Gorge forming renowned rapids like Little Hummer, Funnel Falls, Last Chance and the infamous Skull Rapid.

The first part of this adventure places you in the midst of stark and dramatic desert landscapes. There are two sections to Westwater Canyon with great contrast between the serene solitude of the upper canyon's sandstone walls and the lower canyon's black granite walls and impressive rapids. The awesome landscape and exhilarating rapids motivate you to release your busy life and embrace an adventurous, positive outlook.

You don't have to be experienced to take this river trip; you just need to be seeking some adventure and a little challenge. In the evening we establish camp on the riverbank. While you explore and relax, the guides set up chairs and the kitchen, where they prepare fresh, delicious and abundant meals. The clean air amplifies the vibrant blue sky, creating a perfect environment for hiking and unparalleled photographic opportunities. Depending on the length of your trip, time is set aside for hiking to geological and historical sites. Each day as evening yields to night, the sun melts from the sky and is replaced by a vivid star show that enhances the evolving conversations of the guests.

The Westwater Canyon Experience

Rafting Westwater Canyon

The adventure begins at our river complex in Moab, Utah. After a drive to the launch site, we load the remaining gear onto the rafts, review river safety, and then we're off. The first day is usually a day of leisure and relaxation. Lunch will be on the riverbank where guests assemble their own deli masterpiece. As we proceed downstream, the imposing red sandstone cliffs become the backdrop to shiny black granite walls as the Colorado River descends into Black Granite Gorge. Early each evening the guides pull to the river's edge to an enchanting campsite. After camp is set, you can participate in a guided hike or relax in camp. As the hikers return, the hors d'oeuvres are ready, and dinner is on the way.

By now you have succumbed to the pace of the river, and in the morning you wake to the smell of coffee and the light sounds of the river lapping the shore. After a hearty breakfast, the journey continues. The trip leader describes everything necessary to enjoy the rapids safely. Here are the exciting rapids you have been waiting for. In a short time, the guides navigate the rafts down a series of rapids with names like Little Hummer, Funnel Falls, Last Chance, and of course, the infamous Skull Rapid. After the rapids, there will be time to high-five and relive the past few hours with the other guests. This evening is sure to be filled with conversation about the exhilarating run through "Last Chance." The last day we pull out of the river at about 3:30 PM and have you back to our office by 5:30.

Camping & Hiking

Each evening we establish camp on the riverbank. You will be able to pick your own little tent spot on a beautiful beach while the guides set up chairs and the kitchen. When everyone is ready, your guide will lead you on hikes to secluded canyons and historical sites. You will have time to explore sites along the river that are accessible only through river travel.

THE ARMADA

All of our equipment is top quality, state of the art and carefully maintained and serviced. Each raft is maneuvered by a highly qualified guide. The rafts we use are 17 foot inflatable oarboats, each carrying up to 5 guests. The guides maneuver the raft with a set of oars secured to a frame in the middle of the raft. This is considered more stable than a paddleboat. Paddleboats are available at certain water levels and by advanced reservation only. Paddleboats are inflatable 15-16 foot rafts manned by guests and their paddles. A guide gives instruction and navigates from the back of the raft.

Water Levels

Depending on snow pack and time of year, Colorado River water levels will vary dramatically, creating diverse rafting conditions. Some rapids are more challenging at high water, while others require greater skill at low water. Different flows have their appeal, and we provide specific watercraft that will make the most of each water level. Westwater Canyon rapids are rated II-IV

Geology

Westwater Canyon attracts geologists from around the world. Massive faults distributed tons of rock, leaving fascinating formations seen few other places. The black, uplifted rocks in the Black Granite Gorge (metamorphic granite gneiss) represent the oldest exposed formations in eastern Utah (1.75 billion years) and the river has polished them into odd smooth shapes.

The Weather

You can expect warm, sunny, delightful days in Southeastern Utah. In April through June, high temperatures range between 70° and 90°. July and August high temperatures typically range between 90° and 100°, with September and October temperatures ranging between 70° and 80°. The climate here is very dry with little humidity and is not oppressively sweltering. Summer evenings are quite comfortable though spring and fall evenings can be cool. Other than an occasional rain cloud, there are few overcast days.

MOTION PICTURES
Many production companies used Westwater Canyon to shoot rafting footage for movies, documentaries and commercials. John Wayne filmed here, and the movies "Indiana Jones", "Thelma and Louise" and "Independence Day" were all filmed in this area.

Wildlife

Wildlife is abundant, though often shy. During the heat of the day lizards sun themselves while eagles, vultures and hawks soar on thermal airstreams along canyon walls. In the morning and evening, deer, muskrat, beaver, coyote and great blue heron move along the river's edge. Too warm for trout, the Colorado River supports the endangered Colorado Squawfish and the Humpback Chub. *National Geographic* chose Sheri Griffith Expeditions to guide them through Westwater Canyon to photograph and write of the dramatic scenery and its unique habitat, which are highlighted in their *Wild and Scenic Rivers* book

Orientation

We hold a pre-trip orientation at 5:00 pm the evening before the trip launches. Here you will meet one of your guides, sign your release forms, receive your dry bags (river luggage), learn what to expect and how to prepare, and ask any questions you might have. The orientation is held at our office in Moab, Utah, at 2231 South Highway 191 (the big blue building).

Custom Trips

We can help you schedule other activities in Moab around any of our river adventures. There are a variety of things to do in the Moab area including skydiving, Hummer/ATV tours, canyoneering, guided hikes, horseback riding, mountain biking, and scenic flights. Along with your river trip, we are available to help with booking the above activities as well as to assist with booking your lodging and transportation needs while in Moab.
